Building up to the **United Nations Climate Change Conference** to be hosted by France in December 2015 (COP 21 - Paris Climate 2015), the French Ameri-Can Climate Talks (FACTS) conference series is back for a second edition with **12 events across Canada and the United States** involving renowned scientists, civil society representatives, NGOs, political figures, journalists and entrepreneurs.
